

KING OF DENMARK HONOURS BUFFS.

On his second visit to Canterbury in three years, King Frederick of Denmark as their Colonel in Chief inspects the Buffs before nearly 10,000 friends and former members of this famous Royal East Kent Regiment.

The inspection takes place at the County Ground a few weeks before the Buffs leave for Germany.

A yeoman of the guard watches as His Majesty presents the Regiment with its new colours. In his address to the first Battalion, King Frederick recalls that many of his countrymen fought during the war in the ranks of the Buffs.

After the presentation, the new colours are carried in the march past of the battalion at which the Danish King takes the salute.

Impressive ceremonial marks an occasion which pays tribute both to a proud regiment and to an honoured visitor.
