BILLY GRAHAM PACKS WEMBLEY.

At Wembley, the people of London and the Home Counties gather at the great Empire Stadium - to listen to Evangelist preacher Dr. Billy Graham. Indicative of a religious revival, they come in a constant stream.

In an atmosphere of worship and sincerity, the people hear a message of hope and faith in the future:

Almost bearing out these words, Vienna becomes the scene for Molotov and other foreign ministers to make a decisive move to lessen world tension. The Russian foreign minister has flown in to meet his Western opposite numbers at the Belvedere Palace and sign a treaty making Austria free. Mr. Harold Macmillan, signs for Britain.

M. Pinay signs for France.

Mr. Dulles signs for the United States of America - and the Treaty is complete. By December thirty-first all four countries' occupation forces will be out of Austria. There can be no doubt in Austrian minds that this is a step towards a real world peace!

Further eastwards we look to see what answers are provided in such meetings as this in Warsaw of all the Iron Curtain countries. Marshal Zukov leads the way into the Palace of Ministers.

Now arriving is Russian Prime Minister Marshal Bulganin - followed by Mr. Molotov.

Inside, the Russian Marshals Zukov and Koniev are greeted by Czechoslovakia's Minister of Defence. Formerly Minister of Justice, he is now also Deputy Prime Minister.

During the conference Marshal Bulganin talks of his government's "positive attitude" towards a Big Four meeting and on behalf of the Soviet Government he favours an ending of the cold war. Delegates from all the Communist Countries listen as Bulganin calls for a "real practical solution of the disarmament problem"
