daring episode of the War. Only a few were told the full story at the time. King George the Sixth visited the squadron for a first-hand account from Wing Commander Guy Gibson, the leader of the Dam Busters.

A little more of the story came out when the awards were made, and when Guy Gibson went to Buckingham Palace for his Victoria Cross with his team of the 617 Squadron. 33 of them were decorated.

But until now the story has lived only in print. Not until today, twelve years after the raid, has the world been allowed to see for itself what really happened on that brave expedition.

Twelve years later, to the day,
May the 16th, on the anniversary
of the Dam Busters raid some of
those most concerned have been
brought together. Gathered
