Viet Minh Troops moved into Haiphong driving into Russian made trucks, while the last french troops were still evacuating the best naval base in Indochina/

Withdrawing before the exultant Communist-led forces were small detachments of French Troops who at dawn for the last time saluted the Triceler on the city's citadel where shortly afterwards flew the Viet Minh flag.

French orders had kept the population indoor in the last hours, because several demonstrations had taken place in the past days, rapidly dispersed by police forces. But immediately after withdrawal of French troops. Red flags appeared all over the city while signs on pro French and french shops and buildings were hastily removed and repainted.

Juste before the French left Haiphong, General COGNY with GietNamian General VANUXEN reviewed the Fueign Legion detachments for the That time, and visited the historic French cinetary of Haiphong.
