At the blue ticket stevedores' union headquarters, general secretary Walter Newman, chairman Harry Freeman and their colleagues have been discussing their next move in their tricky situation.

The white-ticket majority report for work at London, Merseyside, Manchester and Hull, but the blue ticket men remain on strike.
