## B-DAY PAINTY RESIDERED!

The Duke of Gloucester visits Bayour to unveil the new memorial to British Commonwealth soldiers who fell in the Mermandy campaign eleven years ago. Accompanied by General Ganeval, representing the French President, the Duke inspects the guard of honour.

On the memorial are the names of nearly 2,000 soldiers whose graves are unknown. Thousands more are buried around the menument, at peace in the French countryside for whose freedom they gave their lives.

The flags fall away - and the Duke salutes, on behalf of us all, these men who were our brethers.

Normandy was William the Conqueror's country, from which he sailed against England nine conturies ago. Above the new memorial is a Latin text which reads "We when William conquered have liberated the land of the conqueror"

The Buke inspects the comstary, while others have their own private hemage to pay. Side by side, Britain and France remember with gratitude the soldiers to whom both owe so much.
