The Royal Highland Show opens in a new site near Edinburgh - and with judging going on in 14 rings at once, these 86 acres are needed. The Duke receives a creek made by Lanark shepherd Ian Brown.

Quality is high this year, particularly the beef shorthorns, and among dairy cattle the British Friesians and Jerseys. Over 2,000 livestock of all classes compete for £15,000 in prizes. This Hereford is a winner in the "cow-in-milk-with-her-calf" class. And among the bull shorthorns, these fine specimens, belonging to Lord Lovat and Mr. P.M. Dickson take first and reserve place respectively.
