OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS, ST ANDREWS.

Girl athletes jump to it in the British Women's A.A.A. Championship at the White City. It's the 80 metres hurdles, with Margaret Francis in the lead. Halle, someone's down. But Margaret, the 22-year old medical student, goes ahead and wins.

They're off! in the 100 yards - and again it's Margaret Francis streaking away to victory in 10 point 8 seconds - the best championship time, but not an official record because there's too much following wind. In a few days, she has some exams to pass - at this rate, she should romp home! Good luck, Margaret!

Over to Scotland where the qualifying rounds of the Open Golf Championship are being played.

Last year's winner Peter Thomson of Australia selects a club. He goes round without trouble in 69. And here's American J.B. McHale, who makes it in 70.

Dai Rees, with 74, shakes hands with Antonio Cerda of Argentina, 73.

It takes all sorts to make a golfing outfit, from Mortie Dutra's ski cap to one end to Bobby Locke's plus-fours at the other. Bobby goes round in 70 - so does Dutra, but on the New Course.

Meet Laurie Ayton of Ipswich, whose 67 is today's best Old Course score, and Joe Carr of Sutton who's done the New Course in 67. - one of ten players who've beaten the New Course record on this memorable day.
