And while the world wenders about Germany's future, a British acredress - Thrusten, in Hants - sees an unusal night. Fifteen Tiger Noths, all em-R.A.F. trainers, are taken over by German pilets.

Their tails beer German markings, Squakronollender Boran-Webb, of the Whiltshire School of Flying, hands over to ex-Laftwaffe bember pilot Captain Barnhard Schloager, who will lead the flight to Corneny. Werner Wegness of Resen is ready to go; so is Hans Staner of Bonn, Many German pilets have made the ene-way trip, but it's sixteen years since they did it this my round.

The aircraft are going to Father Schulte, West Commany's Plying Priest, whose ambition is to make Germany's youth air air andel.
