Three hundred and fifty years age, English shipurights laid the heel of the "Mayflower", the ship in which the Pilgrim Fathers made their historic voyage to America. Today, Mr. Stewart Uphem and foreman George Phillips, at Brixham Hasbour, supervise the laying of a heel to a second "Magflower" She will be a replica of the first, and next year will sail the Atlantic as her producessor did.

At the heel-laying excessey, the honour of closing the great scarfed joint, goes to Lioutenant-Commander D.K. Wilson, R.H. He's descended from a Governor of Massachusetts who was a party to the original Mayflower Comtract, America's first free constitution. The new Mayflower is being built by public subscription as a gesture of Angle-American friendship. The heel's made from Dovon timber.

And this unique medal, in London's Science Masoum, gives you some idea of what the finished "Mayflower" will look like.
