Grim reminders of Hitler's almost complete destruction of Warsaw are still to be seen, but the Poles are a determined people, and their cepital is repidly regaining its pesition as one of Barepe's most beautiful cities. And it's not only their buildings that look goed!

This float symbolises the youth festival Warsaw has been staging this year, while this one bears the word "Feace" in many languages . With sincerity on both sides, may that peace become truly world-wide.
