KOREAN RIOTS.

Now unrest sweeps South Korea's tense and troubled capital of Seoul as angry crowds demand that Polish and Czech members of the neutral armistice commission get out of the country. These true inspectors, they declare, have been spying for the North.

In Incheon harbour, boats circle the commission's headquarters, carrying demonstrators and banners. American troops have been ordered to repel any attacks. South Korean President Syngman Rhee officially discourages mob violence.

But some get ashore and try to storm the compounds.

G.I's. drive them back with fire hoses. Forty-four Americans and a hundred rioters are injured as the clashes spread through South Korea.
