## KOREAN RIOTING

New unrest sweeps South Korea's tense and troubled capital of Secul as angry crowds demand that pro-Communist trues inspectors get out of the country. ROK officials accuse the Gzech and Polish members of the Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission of spying on South Korea for the Reds. Feeling runs high as protesting crowds swarm through the streets of Secul.

In Inchon harbor, boats circle the commission's headquarters on Wolmi Island, urging the expulsion of the Communist representatives. American troops -- ordered to repel any attacks -- mount signs declaring President Rhee's disavowal of violence.

But some still try to crash the compounds and GIs must use fire hoses to drive them back. Forty four Americans and a hundred demonstrators are injured in the sparodic clashes that spread through a secting South Korea.
