U.S.A. FLOOD DISASTER.

In the wake of the murderous hurricanes which tore at America's Atlantic coast comes a new and even greater terror - floods. Six states are declared major disaster areas as the waters rage through town and countryside, drowning hundreds of people and smashing thousands of homes.
