OLD COMRADES REMEMBER.

Field Marshal Montgomery pays a visit to the cemetery at Oosterbeek near Arnhem, where members of the British airborne forces who lost their lives in that unforgettable campaign were laid to rest.

Britain remembers these men as lost brothers, sons and husbands; Holland remembers them as liberators. At Nijmegen, where the Field Marshal had his headquarters during the crucial battles in 1944, the Dutch people welcome him as an old and honoured friend.

The Mayor of Nijmegen, presents Earl Montgomery with the city's medal of honour.

Holland's neighbour, Belgium, also has cause to remember British soldiers who fought in her defence, and at Ypres there is always a welcome for the Old Contemptibles of the First World War who revisit the fields where thousands of their comrades gave their lives.

At Ypres town hall, this latest party of veterans is greeted by the Burgomaster who expresses to them the gratitude which still burns in the hearts of the Belgium people, for the sacrifice which these British soldiers made on their behalf.
