

HARWELL VISIT.

Britain shows her faith in the new world atmosphere by taking the scientists of the world inside her most closely-guarded security fence - the Atomic Energy Research Establishment at Harwell. Over a hundred scientists come from 31 countries on both sides, of the vanishing Iron Curtain. Cameras must be left at the gate, though.

Sir John Cockcroft, Harwell's director, welcomes the visitors.

A word with Professor Vialovskiy, of the Russian team. All these scientists were delegates to the Geneva conference on the peaceful uses of the atom, and Sir John tells them: "This is a fitting end to a fortnight of extremely profitable discussion".
