~~The Prime Minister began his tour of the Fighting Services with a visit at Farnborough Air Show, where he boarded an Avro Vulcan, one of Britain's latest V-Bombers. During the flight Sir Anthony took the controls and saw for himself the impressive performance of this fine aircraft.~~

A more leisurely transport brought the Prime Minister to Colchester on a visit to Army Units there. Major-General Harding, Commander East Anglia District was there to greet him.

After inspecting a Guard of Honour mounted by R.E.M.E. Sir Anthony saw how the modern Army is preparing to counter an atomic offensive - Underground trenches and special gun positions are part of the Army's plan for defence in this nuclear age.

He presented Trophies to the winners of the Royal Norfolk Regiment's shooting competition - and a wooden spoon to Band Sergeant George - who has the fine distinction of being the worst show in the Regiment.
