SIR ANTHONY EDEN, TODAY PAID A THREE HOUR VISIT TO THE ALDER

THE PRIME MINISTER WHO TRAVELLED BY ROAD WAS MET AT THE ESTAB-  
LISHMENT'S MAIN BUILDING INSIDE THE EIGHTEEN FEET HIGH SECURITY  
FENCE BY SIR WILLIAM PENNEY, THE ESTABLISHMENTS' DIRECTOR.
