After four days of hard bargaining, West German Chanceller Kourad Ademanor goes to the last seasion of his Messow tälks with Marshal Bulganin. Flain speaking on both sides, and a few bitter exchanges has led many to expect the talks to end in deadlock.

With Bulgania at the final talks are Karaschev, the Soviet Communist Party secretary, and foreign secretary Helstev.

And their last meeting with Adenausr presents the world with a surprise - an agreement to establish normal diplomatic relations between the two countries. Goupled with this is an assurance that German prisoners of war still held in Russia will be sent home in the near future. Both sides appear to regard this outcome as success. The world will wait and see.

News of the agreement is received with mixed feelings in the west. Mescow will become the first expital with both West and East German ambassadors. Ademaner still does not recognize the Hastern regime, but some fear Mescow may provide a base for unofficial talks on German unity and other subjects which London and Washington would rather see discussed in the open. Others welcome agreement between old enemies as an owen of peace. Time will show who is right.
