Large Parade planned to greet C.D. Director-General.

It is expected that more than 1,500 members of the Civil Defence Corps from all over the Eastern Region will be on parade at Midsummer Common, Cambridge, on Saturday, 24th September, 1955, when they will be inspected and addressed by the Director-General of Civil Defence, General Sir Sidney Kirkman, G.C.B., K.B.E., M.C.
