

ROCKALL BECOMES BRITISH.

Everyone knows the name of Rockall from the B.B.C. weather forecasts, but to most people it was just a name till survey ship H.M.S. Vidal annexed it to Britain in the name of the Queen. Vidal's helicopter takes a landing party to the tiny Atlantic island, 250 miles west of the Hebrides.

Nothing lives here but seabirds, and this is only the fifth recorded human landing. But Rockall's in line with Britain new rocket range, and since no one else claims it - it's safer in British hands.
