CECHCE WASHINGTON'S HOME PESTORED.

Washington Old Hall, County Durham, ancestral home of George Washington's family, velocues V.S. Anhansador Winthrep Aldrich and a guard of the Washington Groys Regiment. The coducion - the restoration of the Old Hall to its former glory, and its opening as an historic minument, provious to two mations. In this guist North Country village, the foreboars of America's first President once ruled as Lords of the Manor.

In this thousand-year-old fant, his ancestors were christened. This village gave him his name, which in turn was given to his country's capital. Legend says his coat of arms gave the States their flag; experts damy it, but at least it's a happy coincidence.

Viscount Gort hands the key of the Old Hall to the Ambassader. Through the conturies, the original monor house was smothered with patchmork rebuilding; but in 1936 a mannittee bought it and set about restering it. This fam was presented to George Washington's wife, Martha by General La Faillette in 1788.

In this house lived the English family which gave birth to the father of a mation.
