PERON FALLS.

Argentina hails the downfall of a tyrant. Four days of civil war bring an end to ten years of tumult. Pictures of deposed dictator Juan Domingo Peron are hurled from windows and burned in the streets of Buenos Aires, with other symbols of a hated regime, while Peron himself takes refuge aboard a Paraguayan gunboat.

This gutted building was the last stronghold of six hundred Peron stormtroopers who were blasted out by rebel artillery when a military junta took control of the State.

Jubilant thousands throng the capital to celebrate the end of a government which has lived by force and finally died of its own medicine. The thousands swell to tens of thousands in front of the presidential palace where the rebel leader, 59-year-old General Eduardo Lonardi, is declared provisional president. South American revolutions have too often taken their peoples out of the flying pan into the fire. May Argentina escape that fate.
