Remarks: The African woman in the picture is Lilian Ngoyi who is the Vice-President of the organization, which calls itself The Federation of South African Women. She is also the Chairman of the Transvaal branch of the African National Congress Women's League. The acting President of the organization is a coloured woman from Cape Town called Gladys Smith, but the coloured woman in the pictures is Sophie Williams who is an organizer for the South African Coloured People's Organization. ^{was there anything unusual about the story?}
If you were assessing it editorially, what would you say? The pregnant Indian woman is Mrs. Rahima Moosa who is an executive committee member and an active member of the Transvaal Indian Congress. The protest march was organized by Mrs. Joseph who lead a working committee. She is by profession a Secretary and Social Worker and has been in South Africa since 1931.
