Champion walkers from seven nations compete in the Italailwa hundred-kilometre race at Seregno, Italy - and they're full of fight, even though it's four in the merning, cold, wet and with 62 miles ahead of them!

England's Den Thomson, of Metropolitan Walking Club, takes an early lead, though there's tough competition from Werner Ljunggren of Sweden. Twenty-two-year-old Thomson already has a London-to-Brighten victory to his credit, but this race is a dozen miles longer. Can be keep it up?

Here's John Ljunggren of Sweden, winner of this event for the past two years. But yard by yard Don Thomson pulls away from him, and finally roups home the victor by over 13 minutes.
