## TEPERTAL JUBILAR.

Importor Haile Selassie of Biblopia arrives for his Silver Jubiles colebrations at the cathedral where he was crowned 25 years age. With his Repress, he is greated on the cathedral steps by two Abbamas, high dignituries of the Coptic church.

The traditional dress of African variors, fashions of modern Burepe, and the pegeantry of medicval Christianity - the coremonial gestures of the Ligaba, (or Master of Coremonies), announcing the reyal arrival - all make a pattern of splendour appropriate to one of the world's most ancient monarchies.

Haile Selassie and his Hagress stand before their thrones while the selemn coremony of the Coptic mass is administered by one of the Abbumas.

The coremony is attended by representatives of the diplem tic corps, and the Emperer's grandshildren have a privileged position.

Christianity in Ethiopia is almost as old as the Christian era itself; the first Bishep of Ethiopia was consecrated about 330 A.D., and for most of the conturies since then it has been a Christian country its kings fought for the Bymantine Repercers, and its people have remained provid werriors through the ages.

The cathedral service is over, and the Reperer, and his consort drive through cheering crowis to the Imperial Palace.

Thus Addis Ababa celebrates the silver jubilee of a monarch whose dignity, when his country stood alone against Mussolini's armies, ceptured the imagination of the world.
