My Lords, Ladies and Gestleman,

I have, on an earlier eccasion, expressed my thanks to the Members of Convocation for the homour which they have done me in electing me to this, the highest Office in the University of London.

The University of London has always endeavoured to adapt itself to changing conditions: it was the first in this country to admit women to its Degrees, the first to appoint a woman as Prefessor, and the first to elect a woman as Vice-Chanceller.
