The Service of Commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the discovery of the Victoria Falls by Dr. David Livingstone, was held on Wednesday, 16th November, in a perfect setting round the statue of David Livingstone on the western edge of the Falls. Under a slightly overcast sky, a gentle breeze blew spray from the Falls over the large crowd which attended the ceremony.

L The morning Service was conducted by the Rev. Cecil Northcote, Chairman of the London Missionary Society, who came specially from London for the occasion. He said that it was appropriate that the London Missionary Society, who had sent David Livingstone to Africa in 1840, should have been represented at the service.

The afternoon service of Rededication was conducted by his Grace the Archbishop of Central Africa, F.F. Paget,. Dr. David Livingstone's grandson, Dr. Hubert Wilson, unveiled the memorial plaque and the Governor-General of the Federation Lord Llewellyn, unveiled the plaque of Rededication.

To round off the ceremony about £1,000 worth of fireworks were set off on the banks of the Zambesi River, that night.
