

NEW DRUG COULD PROVE VITAL WEAPON:

Professor Rubbo and his assistant Miss Janice Nigar in the School of Bacteriology at Melbourne University. The professor and Sydney research scientists Doctor Cyserman-Craig have discovered a new drug which may be the answer to T.B. The drug has been called Verazide and results on guinea pigs have been truly spectacular. But much more testing and research will be necessary before it's administered to humans. Verazide can be fed through the mouth, injected or even given with food. It's non-toxic completely harmless white powder.

Serious lack of funds has hampered research but now that the discovery is showing such impressive early results, this deficiency seems likely to be soon remedied. The doctors refused to patent it and made the formula available to world scientists. This guinea pig injected with live human T.B. bacilli has tubercular ulcers showing on its shaven back. After one dose 75% of the infected animals were cured. All were cured after three doses. This one for instance. Completely healthy with only tiny scars showing.

Dr. Rubbo and his assistant have taken constant personal risk in handling the T.B. bacillus. In Sydney Dr. Cyserman-Craig of Sydney University shares honors equally with Professor Rubbo. He says Verazide is three or four times as potent as previously known anti T.B. drugs. The co-discoverers are confident but urge caution. Time and testing will prove whether the T.B. scourge is to be defeated.
