

SUBMARINERS MEET WORKERS.

The men who sail the Navy's midget submarines meet the men who help to make them. The ship's companies of Britain's first flotilla of midget subs, are "adapted" by a Peterborough firm who manufacture the diesel engines for these powerful little craft.

Lieutenant-Commander Todd commands these craft, seen here at training in Portland Harbour. This one is H.M.S. Stickleback, which carries a crew of five - two officers and three ratings - and it's pretty cramped inside that 54-foot hull.

The workers of this factory take a great interest in the midget subs because they are all powered by the 65 h.p. marine diesels which these men produce. So by getting together, the sailors learn more about their own equipment, and the factory workers understand the problems of the men who must use it in action.
