SOUTHAMPTON TERMINAL.

A splendid new ocean terminal, intended mainly for Union-Castle ships on the South Agrica run, is opened at Southempton by the South African High Commissioner, Mr. G.P. Jooste. Built on the mite of a transit shed destroyed by beabing in 1940, it cost a million pounds to erect.

Lumaricus passenger accomposition eccupies the ground fleer, while cargo is handled upstairs. Travel and trade between Britain and South Africa are growing by large and bounds, and the fine new terminal reflects the over-increasing importance of this lifeline of the Commonwealth.
