SOUTHAMPTON TERMINAL.

A splendid new ocean terminal, intended mainly for Union-Castle ships on the South Africa run, is opened at Southampton by the South African High Commissioner, Mr. G.P. Jooste. Built on the site of a transit shed destroyed by bombing in 1940, it cost a million pounds to erect.

Luxurious passenger accommodation occupies the ground floor, while cargo is handled upstairs. Travel and trade between Britain and South Africa are growing by leaps and bounds, and the fine new terminal reflects the ever-increasing importance of this lifeline of the Commonwealth.
