#### In eather of appearance:

1. THE KALIKPO JUMPERS came from Openi Division in the Rivers Province.

Each village has its "Kalikpo" and for it adopts the form of a particular animal whose masks are then worn by the performers.

This is not so much a traditional dance as a demotic display of acrobatics accompanied by the monster drum.

These acrobatic jumpers are possiliar to Ogund division and they usually perform annually at prescribed seasons.

- 2. St. MARY'S PRACTISING SCHOOL, AGUIU, AWKA. This is a typical the "Attilization" type noted for its tempo, precise footwork and sharp pulsating matter. As will be seen, great energy skill and precision are required in the movements which make this the most vigorous of Eastern Higheston dames. As the drumers beat the initial steps, the leading dameses introduce the most sequence before the main body takes up the rhythm.
- 3. THE UGECRE UMUNWANYA DANCE. From Wanna, Omitache Province is a wann's performance typical of the warious traditional wann's denoce of the area. It is notable for the gay attire of the performers and tasir quick, but graceful movements.
- 4. From the Niger Delta comes the <u>Berry Dence</u>, exotic, vibrating and depicting the movements peculiar to their riverine home. The dences and made of the people of the former Oil Rivers are associated with sec-creatures and the spirits of the deep and their traditional correspondences and most pictures are antibralling.
- 5. From Orlu, in Osmeri Province, comes the KCEANS home, a lively performed by the Ikitenanse girle. This desce, which is antiphenal in form, is EEK introduced in each movement by a small group which is followed by a larger body of dancers who proceed to eleborate on the initial steps.

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
