The Reception of Guests in the Library will commence at 11.50 a.m. At 12.15 p.m., the Lord Mayor will leave the Dais to proceed to the City Boundary at Temple Bar, and his place will be taken by the Senior Alderman, Sir George Wilkinson, Bt., who, with the Lady Mayoress, will continue to receive the Guests until 12.30 p.m.

Upon the conclusion of the Reception the Lady Mayoress and the Guests to be seated at the Royal Table will be conducted to the Grush Room in Guildhall Yard, there to await the arrival of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret. The General Company will proceed to their seats in the Great Hall by way of the Library Corridor and the Corridor in the Temporary building to the north of the Great Hall.

The Lord Mayor upon his return from Temple Bar will await the arrival of Her Majesty The Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh at the Entrance to the Crush Room in Guildhall Yard.

Her Majesty and The Duke of Edinburgh will arrive at 12.55 p.m. The Queen will inspect the Guard of Honour furnished by the Honourable Artillery Company. The Lady Mayoress will have the honour of presenting a bouquet to The Queen.

When The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh reach the Porch the State Trumpeters will sound a Fanfare and the National Anthem will be played by the Band of the Royal Artillery during Their progress through the Great Hall.

When The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh have reached their seats Grace will be said by The Chaplain to the Lord Mayor and Luncheon will be served.

At the conclusion of Luncheon, and after Grace, the Lord Mayor will give the Toast of:-

THE QUEEN

By command of The Queen the Common Cryer will then give the Toast of:-

THE LORD MAYOR AND CORPORATION OF LONDON

Subsequently the Lord Mayor will offer a Welcome to The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh upon Their return from Their visit to Nigeria and Her Majesty will be graciously pleased to reply.

Her Majesty and The Duke of Edinburgh, Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and The Princess Margaret, the Guests at the Royal Table and the Suites in attendance, will be conducted to the Art Gallery by the Lord Mayor and the Lady Mayoress.

The two senior Aldermen, the Sheriffs, the Chief Commoner, the Chairman of the Special Reception Committee, the Mover and Seconder of the Address and their Ladies will have the honour of being presented to The Queen by the Lord Mayor.

The Members of the Suites in attendance having proceeded to their Motor Cars, The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh, Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and The Princess Margaret will be conducted by the Lord Mayor and the Lady Mayoress from the Art Gallery by way of the Library Corridor and the Crush Room to Their Motor Cars.

The Queen has been graciously pleased to dispense with the further attendance of the Lord Mayor and the Sheriffs after leaving Guildhall.

None but the Guests at the Royal Table and the Suites in attendance and the Members of the Corporation to be presented to Her Majesty will leave their seats until after The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh and Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and The Princess Margaret have entered Their Motor Cars.
