During the British rule, Imperial Delhi Horse Show used to be one of the most spectecular events of the year. Horses from all over India and some time from UK and Australia used to participate in this show. In 1942 the show was suspended due to the war and it could not be revived ever since.

Indian Army took the initiative of reviving the show and three years ago they took this scheme seriously. For the first time the show was taking place in front of Red Fort and it attracted large crowd.

To keep on with the dignity of the show and to follow the precedence, the President was to drive in state but due to the sudden death of the Speaker of Imdias Parliament (Mr. MAVLANKAR), there was last minute cancellation in the programme. The flag on the red fort was flying half mast while the horse show continued in the foreground.

Some of the interesting items at the show were Camel display, Tent Pegging, Horse riding and driving the coach (Four in hand)

Another amusing item was a wrestling display between two mules named "GAMA" and "RUSTOM". The show probided a lot of interest when the mules attacked each other. Both the wrestlers were quite strong and the competition ended in a draw without selecting any winner.
