

THE QUEEN IN BRISTOL
AND BATH

The royal barge brings the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh along the River Avon to the heart of Bristol, at the beginning of their visit to the West of England. Nearly four hundred years ago, Queen Elizabeth the First travelled by this same route to visit the city. The Lord Mayor of Bristol, Alderman Harry Creek welcomes the royal visitors. Near the very spot where the first Elizabeth landed.

After opening Bristol's new Council House, the Queen and the Duke wave to the crowd from its balcony.

Bath is also honoured by a royal visit, and the Queen inspects a guard of honour before the great Abbey. She is received at the Guildhall by the Mayor, Mr. A.H. Dix.

At Chew Valley, Her Majesty inaugurates the new reservoir, which has cost £1½ million to build. She unveils a plaque to commemorate the occasion.
