* EDINBURGH AIRPORT:

ARRIVAL *

On arrival at Edinburgh (Turnhouse) Airport at approx. 1505 hours, the aircraft will taxi on to the apron outside the new Civil passenger terminal building.

When Mr. Bulganin and Mr. Kruschev leave the aircraft, they will be greeted by the Secretary of State for Scotland (Rt. Hon. James Stuart, M.P.); Air Commodore J.M. Warfield, C.B.E., Air Officer Commanding No. 66 (Scottish) Group, Royal Air Force; Mr. W.F. Rimmer, Scottish Divisional Operations Officer, Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation; and Wing Commander A.L. Winskill, D.F.C., Station Commander, R.A.F. Turnhouse.

The Station Commander will invite Mr. Bulganin to inspect the guard of honour.

The Guard of Honour, to be provided by R.A.F. Turnhouse, will consist of Flight Lieut. W. Holmes, (guard commander), Flight Lieut. P. Stewart, four n.c.os and 48 airmen, and two trumpeters.

After a general salute has been given, Mr. Bulganin will inspect the Guard, before rejoining Mr. Kruschev and the Secretary of State for introduction to other guests.

They will then leave the airport terminal through the Customs entrance to join the waiting cars.


ONE OFFICIAL SAID: "A PARTY OF BRITISH MEMBERS OF PARLIA-


