Arriving at the Boyal Marines depot in Deal, the Queen Mother is welcomed by Lieutement-General Hardy, the Carpe' Commandant-General. Handsome new quarters for other ranks have just been completed, and Her Majorty is here to open them. The new block will house nearly 800 men, mainly recruits; it has concealed central heating, and parquet floors—not to mention the window-beams.

The First Lord of the Admiralty, Lord Cilcomin, is one of the V.I.P's who accompany the Queen Mother as she chats with youngsters just starting a Marine career.

The Queen Mother's next visit is to the Walmer lifeboat station, escerted by the station chairman Sir Gerald Wellaston. The station was established just a contury ago; since them its beat has been launched 480 times, and has saved 675 lives. The Queen Nother presents Sir Gerald with a contensry wellow in recognition of this fine record of service.

This was one of the 19 lifeboats which helped evacuate the British Army from Dunkirk in 1940 - and many of her crew are still the same. As recently as 1951 - the last German tracer bullet was dig out of the boats' woodwork,
