At the ancient Devenshire herbour of Brizhem, they're building another Mayflower - a replies of the one which carred the Pilgrim Fathers to America. Helidayankers attend a shippard service alongside the half-completed vessel - with girls in Pilgrim's contumes acting as ushers. The service is non-demandational, communerating the original Pilgrims' quest for religious liberty and telerance. The old Pilgrim Fathers' house has been copies too, and it's inspected by retiring L.C.C. Chairman Morman Pritchard and his wife.

What a new ship will look like onn be seen from a model of the original in the Mayflower Masoum, which also contains examples of the tools the old eraftamen used to build the pilgrim ship.

When Mayflower II is completed, she will be sailed by an all-British drew to the United States, as a gesture of Angle-American friendship. She'll be a stardy eraft, for as one of her company has remarked: "We've get so used to seeing those hideous gallooms on Christmas eards, that we forget the old shipwrights knew what they were doing when they built a sailing ship 300 years age". And when the new Mayflower puts to see, her crew can be confident that today's shipwrights have lost none of their ferefathers' skill.
