COMMONWEALTH MEMORIAL NEAR NIJMEGEN

The Duke of Glousester comes to Grossbeck Canadian War Cometery, near Mijmegen, to unveil a memorial to over a thousand Commonwealth seldiers, who died during the final advance into Germany. Pive-hundred pilgrims from the United Kingdom attend the coremony, as well as Prince Bernhard of the Metherlands, and ambassadors from the Commonwealth countries, and countingents from British, Canadian, and Dutch regiments.

The Duke pulls a lever, and one by one the Commonwealth flags fall away from the Mommont, revealing the names of the officers and men, whose sacrifice helped to bring the Second World War to its victorious chd.

The 1st Battalion Reyal Welsh Fusiliers provide the United Kingdom contingent of the royal guard of honour as the Duke and Prince Bernhard lay their wreaths before the memorial - the twentieth completed by the Emperial war Graves Commission since 1945.
