UNVEILING OF THE GROESBERK MEMORIAL

About 500 pilgrims from Great Britain are assembled at the war-senetery of Groesbeek (pronounce: Chroosbake) near Hijmegen, Helland, when the Buke of Gloucester arrives, accompanied by the Frince of the Metherlands.

The high guests are officially welcomed by members of the Dutch Sovernment and by the Ambassadors of the British Commonwealth-countries.

The Duke and Prince Bernhard inspect the guard of honour, which was formed by contingents of X British, Canadian an Dutch regiments.

The Duke of Gloucester holds a speech: "Of this the Memorial erected here at Grossbeek is the counterpart, recording as it does the names of all those who gave their lives in the advance from the Seine and through the Low Countries into Germany, leading to the enemy's final capitu-la tion in May 1945, and to whom too a known and homoured resting-place was denied.

It is now my privilege, on behalf of the Imperial War Graves Commission, to unveil this Memorial to the glory of God and in honour of those brave men who laid down their lives and whose names it commemorates".

Then the guard-detachments come to attention and the Duke unveils the Memorial-stone of Remembrance. (See point 22 of attached programme) Simultaneously the stone panels bearing the 1105 names are unveiled.

The "Last Post" then follows. Part of "Trinity of Love and Power" (see point 28) The wreaths are laid (see point 51, 32, 33) Tour of the cemetary (see point 38) Duke and Prince with relatives (see point 41) Relatives on cemetery.
