## CURUS FIRE

A new terror is added to the ordeal of British troops in Cyprus, as a big forest fire sweeps hundreds of acres of the south-western mountains. Units combing the area for EOKA terrorists find themselves suddenly fighting a blase which races through the tinder-dry pinewoods. Civilians help battle with the flames, but the wind changes, and before long the informo is raging worse than ever.

Twenty servicemen die and 18 are baldy injured - some of them by exploding petrol, when vehicles were trapped in narrow forest tracks; by the advancing fire.

In spite of the fire, the work of rounding up terrorists goes on; some captured BOKA men reveal the secrets of their hideouts, and lead British patrels to the spot. To guard against reprisals, the informers wear hoods over their faces. One by one, the camouglaged positions and arms-dumps are located, and thoroughly searched for any class which may lead to the capture of more of the terrorist leaders.

No one knows yet how the fire began - but the Army suspects ECKA bands may have started it to cover their escape. If so, the Army declares, they have only postpened their capture - for the net is tightening.
