

CYPHUS VILLAGE KILLING.

The Royal Warwickshire Regiment embarks for home at Famagusta Harbour after six months of duty in Cyprus - a difficult duty which no one is sorry to leave, but which today, like all their comrades, have carried out with just the right combination of firmness and good humour.

But for other units, the task of coping with the tragedy of Cyprus still goes on. Towns and villages must still be patrolled, and hidden arms uncovered.

Mr. Justice Shaw, who was wounded by Terrorists near his Nicosia office, is back at work after hospital treatment. For terrorism is not yet crushed. A boy lies dead after a bomb raid at Kouma Tou Yialou, and troops line up the suspects. The murderer tries to escape by bicycle - but too late. An unpleasant job for British servicemen in an island whose crisis remains unresolved.
