

SILVERSTONE GRAND PRIX.

The world's greatest drivers gather for the major event of the Daily Express Silverstone meeting - the British Grand Prix, 305 miles over 101 laps, with the result counting towards the world championship. For the first 15 laps the lead is held by Mike Hawthorn in a B.R.M. No. 23,

Stirling Moss in a works Maserati is keeping well up among the leaders, and so is his team-mate Jean Behra. Only two points separate them in the contest for the world title. Top of the list by a clear five points is Peter Collins he's driving a Ferrari today - No.2.

The crowd rush forward as Tony Brooks has a narrow escape when his B.R.M. crashes. But he gets away with slight commussion and a broken jaw.

Now Fangio's leading, with Collins chasing him - but reigning champion Juan Fangio holds his Ferrari in front like the master he is, and wins handsomely!

Fangio's wife is here to congratulate him on a victory which has improved his chance of retaining the world title. But in his moment of triumph, he doesn't forget to say "Hard Luck, Stirling"
