

THIRD TEST.

Australia all out and following on. That's the situation as Trusman bowls to Macdonald. England 182 ahead - and the Aussies in real trouble. The second innings score is only 10 when Trusman dismisses Macdonald.

But now, in spite of all Laker can do, Harvey and Miller start to dig themselves in. The score creeps steadily upwards - and Harvey makes his half-century.

And Johnson's caught at short leg. 136 for six - but while Harvey's still there's England may well have to bat again. It's Lock who bowls and catches him, after a gallant innings of 69 - exactly half the Australian score on the board.

And now the collapse. Lock to Archer, who bangs him to mid-off - but Washbrook's there, and catches him neatly. Maddocks is out l.b.w. for a duck, soon Laker bowls Mackay with a Yorker. Victory for England by an innings and 42 runs - thanks above all to Washbrook, May, Lock, and Laker!
