## NEW YORK FIRE,

New York firemen fight the city's most savage blase in twenty years at a former department store which has been a "Manhatten Landmark" since the Civil War. Throughout the night, 600 firemen pour 7,000 gallons of water a minute, into the five-storey inferno.

The old stere, which was being term down, was a marvel of construction in its day - iron-fronted, but with wooden beens and partitions, which now feed the flames from cellar to roof.

It takes 25 hours to control the blase. But water floods into the subway, putting one line out of action for at least two weeks and dislocating traffic to the heart of the city.
