SUEZ CONFERENCE.

Fereign Secretary Selwyn Lleyd arrives at Languager House for the 22-matien Sues Conference, followed by Australian premier Robert Mensies. Only Greece, and Hypyt herself, have refused Britain's invitation to attend. West Germany is represented by premier Heinrich von Brentane.

For New Scaland, Mr. Thomas Macdonald, Minister of External Affairs.

Bussia's new Fereign Minister Duitri Shepilev arrives with Ambassader Malik - and for Japan, Fereign Minister Mamoru Shigamitsu, the man who signed for surrender in 1945. The delegates gather with widely differing views, but there are signs that all are open to discussion and that some form of agreement may be possible. America's Secretary of State Poster Dalles brings a plan, agreed with Britain and Frame, for international control of the Canal. The main opposition is expected from the Bassians, but they, too, seen open to debate. To open the conference, comes Britain's premier Sir Anthony Béen.

Sir Anthony Eden is not taking part in the conference itself; leadership of the British delegation falls to fereign secretary Selwyn Lleyd, after the prime minister's welcoming speech:

> "Gentlemen, on behalf of Her Majesty's Government of the United Kineden I welcome you here to this conference in London, we are grateful for your acceptance of the invitation to attend this meeting. The occasion for calling it must rank smong the greatest that any of us have had to face since the Second World War. Rach one of the mations represented here is decaly concerned, either by reason of its shipping or its trade. All have a common interest to the scantity of agreements. On a number of occasions I have attended international discussions in these rooms and many of you who are listening to me are friends and colleagues of many years standing. The result of your work together has never mattered more. With sinebilty I bid you welcome with conviction I express confidence that good will result from your council. I wish God Speed e all your efforts, Good morning - and good luck!"
