GERMANS RECEIVE WINGS.

Air Vice Marshal Chamberlain pins R.A.F. wings on Colonel Wehnelt of the new Luftwaffe, at Fighter Command headquarters, Stammers. Major Barkhorn also receives the famous badge. They are two of the German pilots who have been training with the R.A.F. at Feltwell in Suffolk; the third is Major Krupinski. For them, it has been a refresher course in modern methods; all three are seasoned wartime pilots, claiming between them more than 500 victories against Allied aircraft.

Major Barkhorn has eight years' service with the German Air Force, and re-enlisted this year. Major Krupinski, with six and a half years, has been in the new Luftwaffe for three and a half. The German trio take off in R.A.F. Hunters to show that they have absorbed their training thoroughly. Now they'll be returning home, to pass on to German air force recruits what they have learned from the R.A.F. Who would have prophesied this ten years ago?
