DIDITAL TRAIN DISASSER

Search is made in the wreetage of the Bengalore capress
for victims of one of India's worst train diseasors for many years.
At least 112 people were killed when a small river bridge, weakened
by floodwater colleged under the engine, and the first two coaches
were crushed like eggshells. The engine plunged against the farther
bank but the crow escaped with their lives. By a mear-miracle, the
remaining six coaches stayed on the track, otherwise the lossef life
would have been for greater.

The crash came just before one e'clock in the merming, and it
was many hours before even a few of the bodies could be identified. The
first coach was a packed 70-coater, and not one of its occupants
survived, a tragic circumstance, for some of the following coaches
were almost capty. The swellon river is believed to have carried
away many victims of this grim diseaster.
