

WHITE CITY SPORTS:

The women's 100 metres in the Daily Express meeting at the White City. Britain's Ann Pashley and June Paul lead all the way, with a Dutchwoman and three Germans behind them. It's so close that the first three all clock 11.9 seconds - but Ann, No.4. is the winner by inches, with June second.

Here's the last lap of the men's 5,000 metres, with Gunter Havenstein of East Germany leading Sando and Perkins of Britain.

Into the straight, and a German victory looks certain - Frank Sando can't possibly catch him - but he's doing it! A fantastic burst carries him past Havenstein to win!

A splendid triumph for pocket-sized Frank Sando - and one of the few bright spots in a black day for Britain's Olympic hopes. The crowd looks for fireworks in the 1,500 metres. East German champion Klaus Richtsenhain leads Chris Chataway and Gordon Pirie at the start of the final lap.

And now Pirie makes his challenge - he passes Chataway and pounds after the German, gaining on him inch by inch!

Now Gordon Pirie's drawn level - but Richtsenhain's fighting hard! He's holding his own - and as they round the last bend into the straight, he puts on the pressure - Pirie's losing ground and Chataway's twenty yards behind!

The German wins! But it was a magnificent challenge by Pirie, and he still managed to clock his best-ever time for the distance. Hard luck, Gordon!
